Public Health Notice to School Community Confirmed Case of COVID-19 at University of King's College

May 8th, 2021

Dear Student/Staff,

Public Health is investigating a confirmed case of COVID-19. The person who tested positive is connected with University of King's College. Based on our findings to date, potential exposure to COVID-19 could have happened on April 26th, 27th, 28th, 29th, May 1st and/or May 2nd.

We recognize that receiving this information may be stressful and want to ensure you understand the process going forward.

Through our investigation, Public Health will:

- identify anyone who has come into close contact with the case
- send a letter to all close contacts as soon as possible
- follow-up with the close contacts directly and arrange further sequential testing

If you do not receive a separate letter and phone call, you are not a close contact.

However, out of an abundance of caution, Public Health is recommending that all students and staff be tested for COVID-19, whether or not you have symptoms. Please visit <https://covid-self-assessment.novascotia.ca/en> to book a COVID-19 test or call 811 and identify yourself as someone Public Health asked to be tested from University of King's College.

As this is a precautionary measure, you are not required to self-isolate while waiting for your test result, unless you have any symptoms. If you have or develop any symptoms you must self-isolate while waiting for your test result. Symptoms include fever, new or worsening cough, sore throat, runny nose/nasal congestion, headache, or shortness of breath.

All students/staff are asked to monitor for symptoms of COVID-19. The daily checklist is available at <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/docs/Daily-COVID-checklist-en.pdf>

If you, or anyone in your household has or develops:

- fever
- cough (new or worsening)
- sore throat
- runny nose
- headache
- shortness of breath
